CPES Education Program: Impact at UPRM

Abstract—The Center for Power Electronic Systems is a National Science Engineering Research Center Lead by Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. The Center is composed by Virginia Tech, University of Wisconsin - Madison, RPI, North Carolina A&T, and the University of Puerto Rico at Mayaguez. The pooling of educational resources from the 5 institutions provide excellent educational opportunities in most areas of power electronics to participating students not available in a single campus. At UPRM the participation in CPES has prompted the growth of the power electronics area at the graduate and undergraduate level.
